# Volusia Forever Implementation


- County Council appointed an oversight advisory board March 2<sup>nd</sup>

- Tax levy and possible bond issue not until after October 30th




**History of Land Conservation**

# Volusia Forever Approved 2000



## Keys to the success of prior programs



Sticking to procedures

## Acquisition process

Property is nominated

#### **COUNTY STAFF**

- 1. Solicits willing sellers
- 2. Reviews against criteria
- 3. Gives nominator & property owner a draft report; accepts additional information


#### **ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

- 1. Reviews staff report against criteria. Property must meet 10 of 18 criteria. 5 of 9 members must agree criteria have been met.
- 2. Properties ranked as Group A (highest priority; potential for matching funds) and Group B (important but lesser priority)

#### **COUNTY COUNCIL**

- Receives Group A
   list for approval to purchase.
- 2. May not add a property to list that is not deemed eligible.

Property > \$500,000 in value must have two, current independent appraisals within one year of purchase



### Proximity and connectivity

- Functionally adjacent to already-conserved land
- Will maintain an ecological link or habitat corridor between two unconnected conservation areas.

### Furthers prior acquisition efforts

- · Will complete a project already begun
- There's a reasonable expectation of matching funds

- Environmentally-sensitive lands
  - Potential to protect or maintain populations of Federal or State-listed species
  - Contains viable acreage of 1+ scarce, unique or significant upland communities (ecosystems)
  - Will protect fragile coastal resources





#### Water resources

- Serves an important groundwater recharge function
- Contains or fronts a waterbody, wetland or waterway
- Contains springs or other unique geological features
- Has potential as source of potable water





#### Management

- Size & location make cost-effective management feasible Limited exotic or invasive species
- Existing & future adjacent land use will make management possible
- Has good access
- Wetlands don't need extensive restoration
- Uplands don't need extensive restoration



- Resource-based recreation lands
  - Has potential to establish or improve resource based public use, including greenways, blueways and trails




Amendment 1 passed 2014

**Great American Outdoors Act 2020** \$900 million per year Land and Water Conservation Act








## **Volusia Conservation Corridor**



## Financing Volusia Forever

#### Annual ad valorem tax

• 20¢ on every \$1000 of taxable property value
